skill repertoire the book is designed to prepare students for field placement and therefore has a strong vocational focus introduces counselling skills in a logical sequence and provides practical examples of the skills in action discusses the process of change involved in counselling provides approaches for counselling people with specific problems such as anger depression grief suicidal ideation discusses professional issues including confidentiality ethics record keeping
